Nursery:

9-12 (11.30 to 12 optional snack time) morning
12.30-3.30 (12.30 to 1 optional snack time) afternoons

Reception:

8.55 start
3.20 finish

Please make sure your child attends every day and on time.

Sickness: If your child is absent please phone the school office on the first day of their absence – from 8.30 onwards or leave a message on the answering machine.

If you know your child is going to be absent please let the office know as soon as possible.

Once your child returns to school they should bring in a letter explaining why they were absent.

School Uniform

Not compulsory for Nursery, just Reception onwards

Jewellery

- ◆ In the interest of safety no jewellery should be worn.
- ◆ The only exception is plain stud earrings.

Girls

black or grey trousers, pinafore or skirt
white polo shirt or white shirt
royal blue cardigan or sweatshirt or fleece
plain black, grey or white socks or tights
royal blue/white check summer dress
black shoes (heels no higher than 2.5cm)

Boys

black or grey trousers
white polo shirt or white shirt
royal blue sweatshirt or fleece
plain black, white or grey socks
black shoes – no trainers

PE Clothing

Foundation Stage/KS1

shorts/jogging trousers (cold weather)
T-shirt
plimsolls

Getting ready ...

- ◆ Attend briefings in the summer term
- ◆ Appointments for home visits will be given out at the meetings or sent to home address
- ◆ Home-school agreements to be signed
- ◆ 1 hour taster sessions in Reception for children (parents/carers required to stay) in September, followed by half-days
- ◆ Children will be full-time by October half-term **only** if staff feel they are ready

Dates and deadlines

- ◆ List the schools in the order of preference
- ◆ 2 proofs of address: UK driving licence, council tax bill, utility bill less than 3 months old, birth certificate/medical card
- ◆ Deadline – return application forms by **15th January 2013**
- ◆ Return form, in person, to any of schools you have nominated no later than 11th Jan or to Enfield Schools Admission Service, Civic Centre
