New Department for Education Assessment Guidance

Changes in Government guidance are now being introduced, with a move away from "levelling" pupils eg 2b, 4b to assessing without levels using the new curriculum expectations which have been in place since September 2014. This change only applies to Years 1, 3, 4 and 5 this year as the current Years 2 and 6 are still studying under the "old" curriculum.

From September 2015 all year groups will be assessed without levels using the revised National Curriculum Framework. As we are at the early stages of introducing these changes there will be a period of transition as the teachers begin to use the new procedures for assessing without levels.

Later this term we will be running parent/carer workshops explaining the new expectations for each year group and guidance will be published on our website. The first briefings on Maths are:

19 March 9.10 Years 3-6 Maths

19 March 2.40 Reception, Y1-2 Maths

For the current Year 5 we also will cover the new expectations as part of the Year 6 - 2016 school journey briefing which will be held in June. Details will be published in a newsletter nearer the time.
