Last Tuesday we were treated to a design workshop from the creators where the children were shown how they make the characters and each child was given the opportunity to create their own characters.

WPC Ashite visits

Our new school Community Police Officer has started to come into school to talk to classes and present assemblies.

Over the last two weeks she came and spoke to some children in Year 2 and 5 about making right choices . The children were given an insight about what anti-social behaviour is and they were shocked to learn that they could all be arrested and charged when they are 10 years old if they make wrong choices!

The children were given an opportunity to ask lots of questions about her role in our community. The children were interested to see the equipment she has to arrest criminals. WPC Ashite enjoyed her visit and is looking forward to coming back soon.

Year 5 Ancient Greek Day



On Friday 6 March, Year 5 came into school dressed as Ancient Greeks. The day started with a murder mystery activity where the children had to work in teams to study evidence and work out who killed an Athenian hoplite. After break, the children were divided into Athenians and Spartans and recreated the Olympic games and true to form, the Spartans won. The day finished with a banquet where the children ate Greek food. The children made a huge effort and the Year 5 team would like to thank the parents/carers for their support in helping their children with their costumes.

Year 3's Ancient Egyptian Day

On the 26 February, Year 3 had an Ancient Egyptian day at school, as part of this term's history topic. The children and teachers all came to school dressed in fantastic Ancient Egyptian costumes, complete with headdresses and props. At the beginning of the day, the children 'Walked like an Egyptian' and modelled their costumes in a year group

fashion show. The children then learnt about the hierarchy of Ancient Egyptian society and when different Pharaohs ruled. In the afternoon, the day finished with an Egyptian feast where children ate food similar to the Ancient Egyptians.



Book Week

The week of 2-6 March was World book week. At Highfield we love books: reading them to out friends, being inspired to write our own book or just sitting quietly, enjoying reading. Book Week was an opportunity to see performances, invite authors to talk to us and have class workshops.

Years 1 and 2 were able to have 'Hue Boy' read to them by its author Rita Mitchell. They had plenty of questions for Rita. She was very impressed by their knowledge and understanding of the issues that were dealt with in the story.

KS1 viewed a performance by the Drama group 'Caboodle'. They saw several traditional tales combined to make a new story. The children were able to point out every one of the tales featured in the performance. They then had workshops with the actors, where they took traditional characters and took them on journeys quite unfamiliar to them.

KS2 saw a presentation by the author Sita Brahmachari who spoke to them about her book 'Artichoke Heart'; looking at objects that invoke memories of stories that are very special and how we are on the outside can often hide what's inside: our own artichoke hearts. Years 5 and 6 had the opportunity to work with Sita in their classrooms, and together they created their own artichoke display in which children described their own precious memories. Years 3 and 4 worked with our Poet in Residence, Cheryl Mokowitz. Year 3 made a book mark, looking at reading spaces (real and imagined) while Year 4 created a book cover of a book they would love to read. Through this they created a shared poem which was presented at an assembly on 20 March (World Poetry Day celebrations).



Poetry Corner - Poet in Residence

Every month is poetry month at Highfield, and March has been no exception. As well as poetry happenings during Book Week and as part of Comic Relief, there are now several regular poetry groups running. FREEDOM WRITES (Heru, Antonia, Mirela, Jesse,

Islimada and Callum from 4C) has been meeting for the past few weeks during Guided Reading time to create a poetry anthology on the theme of 'Freedom'. Another group (Yousra, Alexander, Ryan, Yekta, Sophia, Jackson, Holly, Maddy, Thara) have been writing poetry about family - in particular, about 'Mothers' - for Mother's Day and at lunchtimes there has been a 'Poetry Surgery' for anyone who wants to come and workshop poetry ideas. This has been very enthusiastically attended. Rainbow Rhymes (EAL children and their parents) will continue in the Summer term. Sessions have been planned for Friday 24 April and Friday 5 June. Reminder letters will be sent out nearer the time.
