


Poetry Achievements continue.....

It was most useful to know how the classroom works and what is expected from our children and from us — Year 1

"Snacks" for children in Year 3 to Year 6

All our children from Nursery to Years 2 receive a piece of fruit or vegetables daily from the government scheme; these are given to the children to eat during the morning session.

If you would like your child in Y3 to Y6 to have a snack during morning break then we ask you to give them a piece of fruit or vegetables only. Other snacks such as crisps, chocolate, biscuits etc will not be permitted.

We need to promote the children to a healthy eating option. We do encourage parent/carers to ensure that healthy options are in your child's packed lunch box.

Every Friday there is a healthy tuck shop for children in Y3 to Y6, healthy snack options are available for them to purchase, and they can bring in 60p to spend on Fridays!!
