DRIVING SAFELY & PARKING AROUND THE SCHOOL

Thank you to the majority of parent/carers who are taking road safety outside our school very seriously.

It is so important that everyone does this to avoid putting our children in danger. It is in the interest of all our children that everyone drives carefully.

We have also noticed a few drivers who have been parking on the yellow zig-zag lines to drop off some children. Not only is this dangerous but it is also against the law.

Parent/carers must be mindful of where they can or cannot park – Please do not park across residents driveways.

Could we please ask parent/carers NOT to turn their vehicles into the car park entrance of the school. Children and parents are walking across it. We need to keep everyone safe.



Healthy snack guidance:

We allow children to have a healthy snack at break time. Children in Early Years and KS1 are provided with a piece of fruit/vegetables, while in KS2 parents/carers have the option to provide their child with a healthy snack, for break time.

There has been some confusion and debate about what constitutes a healthy snack and after looking at NHS advice and understanding the need for clarity on this issue we have decided for KS2 a **healthy snack is a piece of fruit or a vegetable**. This is in line what is provided for children in the Early Years and KS1.











Young Interpreters

At Highfield we are very lucky to have pupils that speak many different languages. Each year we have a group of children that take on the role of Young Interpreters.

The role of Young Interpreters is to show visitors around the school, particularly new children who don't speak English and their families. 
