# Year 6 trip to the Science Museum

On Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> January, Year 6 visited the Science Museum. Space travel was the theme of the day to link with this term's topic of Time and Place, Earth and Space.

The children enjoyed a talk by the Astronaut Gene Cernan (an actor) who showed the children Apollo 10 and shared the experiences of space travel from blast off to re-entry of the Earth's atmosphere. The children learnt what it was like to be an astronaut, how you eat and drink in space, what you wear and what it feels like to have no gravity. Did you know the moon's surface is like stepping on powder? Gene Cernan said the moon was rather rocky and had no weather. We found out that Gene Cernan wrote his daughters initials on the moon and it would still be there today as there is no wind to blow it away.

Adrien said, "I liked this trip because we had time to learn about space and visit the space gallery. The

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rockets were huge!" Rim enjoyed seeing the actual Command Module of Apollo 10. "It's actually been in space," she exclaimed.
