Reception Curriculum News.

Topic: Rulers and Governments.

Mathematics:

Emphasis this term will be on numbers to 10, 20, and beyond; 2D and 3D shapes, patterns and simple addition. We will also begin to learn about differences in height and length.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

We will be working on developing children's confidence and independence in all areas, including negotiating to sort out conflicts and talking to others about their feelings. We will also be looking at issues as they arise within our classes, such as friendships and how we are all the same, yet different.

Communication and Language:

Children will be encouraged to develop their listening skills in a range of situations, and to respond appropriately. We will also be working on maintaining attention, concentration and focus.

Physical Development:

We will aim to do PE regularly in the hall, and will be learning about the effects exercise has on our bodies. We will also be continuing to work on strengthening hand muscles to develop fine motor skills and effective pencil control.

Literacy:

Phonics will continue to be taught daily, but will now be taught in ability groups. Homework will be differentiated to reflect the teaching and learning within the phonic sets. Children will be encouraged to use their increasing phonic knowledge to develop independent writing.
