#### New Families are Welcomed to Highfield Primary School

We welcomed 150 families who will join our school in the Nursery and Reception classes in September 2017. The meeting enabled the parent/carers to meet the staff. They received information and procedures for the induction procedures were talked through (the power point presentation is on the school website).

#### For September 2017...

Our 60 place Nursery is full with 61 families on the waiting list. We received 373 applications for our 90 places in Reception. We have a very long waiting list and some families are going through the appeal system. This speaks volumes for the respect the community have for the education that we provide for all our children. I hope you are as pleased as we are that you have been offered a place at our school. Working together for your children is something we very much look forward too.

A year 6 pupil says "The feeling of being in a bright and happy school is amazing. To combine fun with learning gives us energy and turns us into happy and healthy children. Behind the scenes of all these changes is a person like Mrs Dunbar who is working effortlessly to accommodate all the needs required. However it's wonderful for Mrs Dunbar that she can retire, she's certainly put the years in! She will be able to do whatever she wishes to do! # **Safeguarding**

#### **E-Safety**

There are many ways we can support young children when using online resources. We want young children to use the internet in a well-supported and safe way. They need to be SMART:

*Safe*: Don't give personal information out such as email, home address or school name.

*Meet*: Meeting someone in real life that you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous. Only do so with your parents' or carers' permission.

*Accepting*: Accepting emails, messages or opening files, images or texts from people you don't know or trust can lead to problems.

**Reliable**: Someone online might lie about who they are. Information on the internet may not be true. Always check information by looking at other website, in books, or ask someone who knows.

*Tell*: Tell a parent, carer or a trusted adult if someone, or something, makes you feel uncomfortable or worried, or if you or someone you know is being bullied online.

Thank you to everyone that has given in the Sainsbury's active kids vouchers. We have now been able to get new playground equipment for the children to enjoy. Many thanks.


# Amazing Art!
