Mathematics:

We will be working on a range of concepts, including:

- Counting to ten, and beyond, with 1:1 correspondence.
- Recognising numbers.
- 2D shapes.
- Understanding and using mathematical vocabulary.

Literacy:

We have begun to talk about the sounds that the letters of the alphabet make, and we will be learning a new sound each week, following the Letters and Sounds phonics program.
