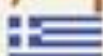

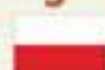

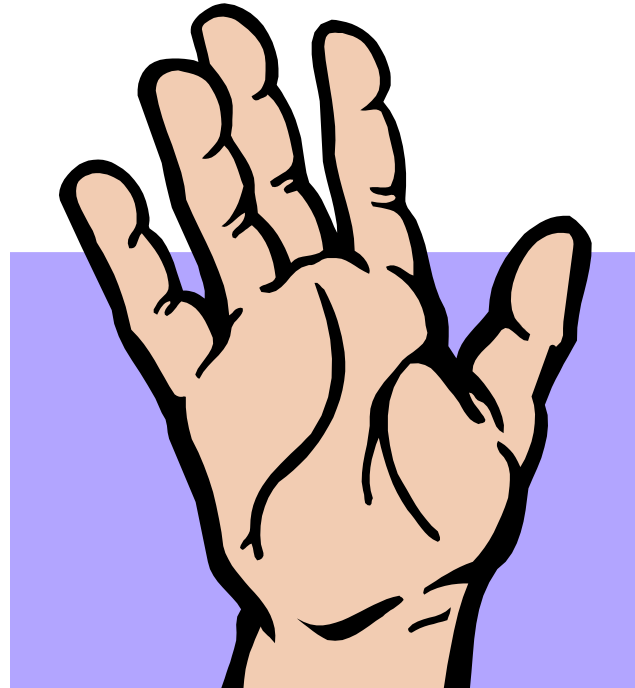

# School Uniform

- **Jewellery** - In the interest of safety no jewellery should be worn.

white T-shirt – plimsolls or all black trainers (must be different to school shoes)

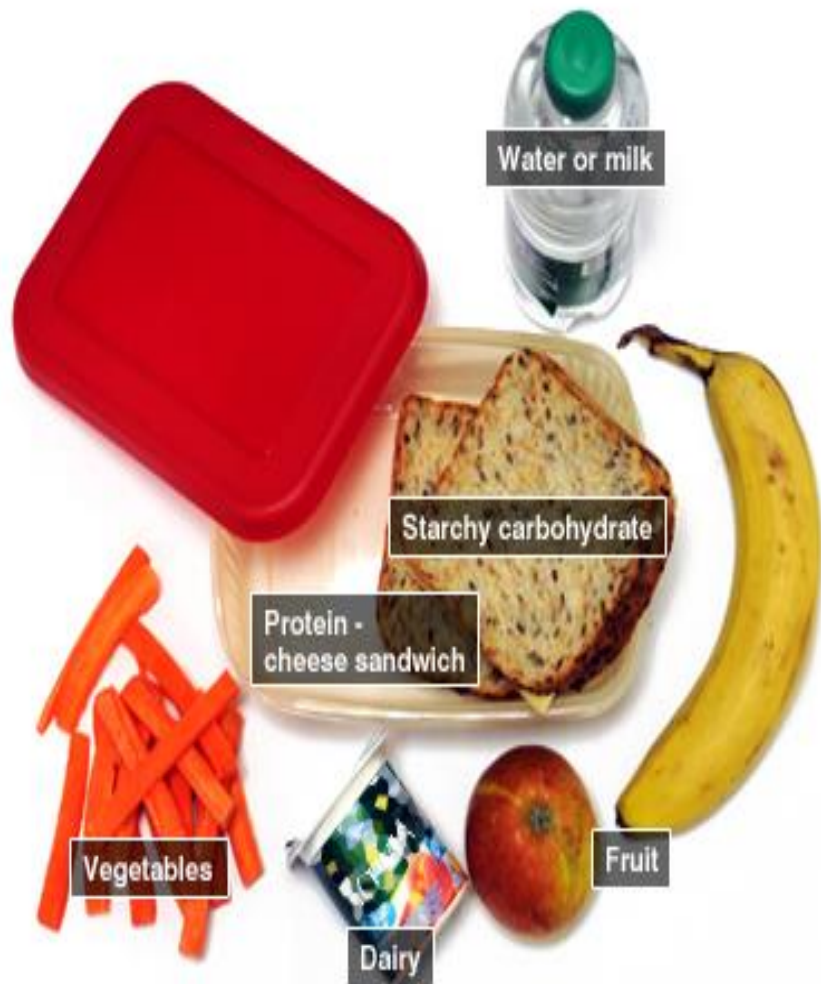

# Weekly Routine

- PE. kit sent home at half term
- Water bottles sent home weekly
- Book bags everyday – return books Wednesday to be sent out again Friday.
- Each child gets a Reading Record/Home School book – if it is lost you will have pay £1 to get a new one.
- Bug Club books set termly online – password will be put in front of Reading record books (if your child is using an iPad you will need to install Photon – see school website for details)
- Word Lotto – return by Wednesday – sent home on Friday
- Homework – formally starting beginning of October – Sent home on Fridays (Spellings every week English and Maths alternate)
- Spellings – Tested Wednesdays. New spellings sent home every Friday (starting beginning of October)
- Library books returned on Thursday.

# Spelling and Phonics

These are at the core of the English curriculum.

By the end of Year One children must:  
Know and use all the first 50+ Phonemes  
Know how to use and spell in dictated sentences - the first 41 tricky words  
(in hand out)
