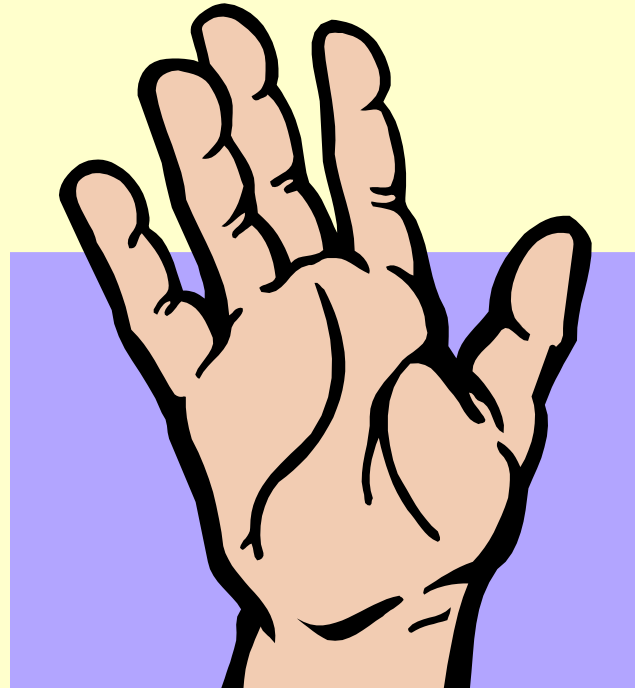

Class Rules

School Uniform

Girls

Weekly Routine

- PE. kit sent home at half term
- Water bottles sent home weekly
- Book bags everyday – return reading books Monday to be sent out again Wednesday
- Each child gets a Reading Record/Home School book – if it is lost you will have pay £1 to get a new one.
- Bug Club books set termly online – password will be put in front of Reading record books (if your child is using an iPad you will need to install Photon – see school website for details)
- Word Lotto – return by Thursday – sent home on Friday
- Homework – formally starting beginning of October – Sent home Fridays (Spellings every week English and Maths alternate)
- Spellings – Tested Wednesdays. New spellings sent home every Friday (starting beginning of October)
- Library books returned on Wednesdays.
