Attendance and Punctuality



The day: 8.50 doors open, children must be in school by
8.55am. 3.20 - home time. <u>Please make sure your child attends</u> every day and on time.

Sickness: If your child is absent please phone the school office on the first day of their absence.

If you know your child is going to be absent please let the office know as soon as possible. Once your child returns to school they should bring in a letter explaining why they were absent.

Collection: If you know another person will be picking up your child, please fill in the collection form. These can be found at the office.

In an emergency or if you are running late, please ensure you ring the school office.

- If child is collected for a medical/dental appointment we need to be informed beforehand
 at the latest by 9.30am on day of collection.
 We need to know what time you will be collecting them so we can get your child ready.
- Holidays will not be authorised during term time. If you need to take your child out of school for any reason then please complete an exceptional circumstance form.

Uniform Labelling

- Please ensure that your child's uniform and PE kit is clearly labelled with a permanent marker or label.
- In KS2 the children are put into team colours. Your child should have a plain or school t-shirt in their team colour as part of their PE kit. Children are only allowed plain black trainers and plimsolls for indoor PE.

Jewellery

• Due to health and safety it is important that children wear only small stud ear-rings. (religious jewellery is allowed as long as it does not compromise the health and safety of the child or other children)





- Monday (Indoor) and Friday (Outdoor)
- Please ensure your child has appropriate clothing for both outdoor and indoor PE lessons. (e.g. shorts and a t-shirt, long sleeved sweatshirt, jogging bottoms and plimsolls/trainers).
- Please ensure that your child also comes to school with a water bottle on PE days in order to stay hydrated.

The Creative Curriculum



- Highfield continues to follow a more Creative Curriculum.
- Learning is topic based and centres on the new National Curriculum.
- This term the whole school topic is 'Step Back in Time' where we will be exploring the history of the Ancient Egyptians as well as making our own mini time machines.

Transition into KS2

- Longer mornings: Please ensure your child has a piece of fruit or vegetable for morning break.
- Can children also bring a water bottle in daily so that they can stay hydrated throughout the day. Water bottles must be taken home at the end of the day and be labelled clearly with your child's name.



- Higher expectations of independence both academically and emotionally.
- Currently the children are getting afternoon play. This will be phased out over the course of the next few weeks.

Homework

- Homework will go out on a Friday in children's homework books.
- Children should expect to get 2 pieces of homework a week. This may include a piece of research or an investigation. Maths homework may also be set on 'My Maths'.
- Homework is always set to consolidate and extend children's current learning.
- Homework is expected to be completed and should be returned by **Tuesday**.
- It is your child's responsibility to hand in their homework in the homework box.

Spellings and Times Tables

- Your children will be having a weekly spelling test in the form of dictation.
- They will need to know what these words mean and how to spell them properly.
- Spellings will be tested once a week and will be handed out with homework.
- Times tables will be tested once a week. They need to be learned by heart and out of order.



Reading

- Children will bring home two books at their reading level each Monday or Tuesday. Please comment regularly in their home school diary, and encourage your child to do the same.
- The new reading records also have activities and questions for your children to complete.
- When appropriate we will update you with how your child is reading in class. Please look in the home school diaries regularly for our comments.



- **Book bags:** These need to be brought in **everyday** and should be a sensible size.
- It is essential that your child is reading daily for 15 minutes in order to further their reading development. Please share more complex stories to your children to support their comprehension skills.



Internet safety

- Please help us to ensure your child is safe when using the internet. We will cover E-Safety each term with the children in class activities.
- There is an excellent website that will inform you and your child about the appropriate uses and dangers of the internet.
