Golden Rules

- 1.We are kind and helpful and respect each other's cultures.
- 2. We enjoy learning in class and let others do the same.
- 3.We are polite to each other and take it in turns to speak
- 4. We always behave sensibly and safely in school.
- 5. We listen to the staff and do what they say straight away
- 6.We take care of our school and equipment.

School agrees to:

- encourage children to follow the Golden Rules and to do their best at all times
- value every child irrespective of ability, race, gender, religion, age or achievement
- encourage each child to achieve his/her full potential
- listen to children and parents/carers and be seen to act appropriately on legitimate concerns
- inform parents about what the teachers aim to teach each term
- at regular meetings inform parents of children's progress

Family agrees to:

- encourage their child to follow the Golden Rules, do their best at all times and be a good role model for Highfield Primary School.
- ensure that child attends school regularly and take their holidays during the school holidays.
- ensure their child arrives at school on time and is collected on time:
 - > 8.50am-3.20pm for Key Stage One and Two children (Reception-Year 6)
 - 8.55am-11.45 for morning Nursery children OR 12.30-3.30 for afternoon Nursery children
- Make the school aware of any concerns or problems that might affect their child's work or behaviour using the school procedures: <u>first</u> make an appointment with the class teacher, <u>then</u> the phase leader/learning mentor, <u>then</u> a member of the senior management team and finally the Headteacher.

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- Support their child in completing their homework
- Attend open evening(s) to discuss their child's progress
- Ensure that their child comes to school wearing the correct school uniform, PE kit and is properly equipped
- Follow the school's Code of Conduct as a parent/carer/visitor (in the school's Visitor Behaviour Policy) and summarized below:

STATEMENT OF EXPECTATIONS OF BEHAVIOUR

- Our staff will be polite and courteous towards you at all times.
- In return it is our expectation that you will be polite and courteous to staff. If staff are subjected to unacceptable behaviour they have been instructed to end the discussion with you and inform you of the reasons. You will be asked to leave the premises. A letter to confirm the reasons why you were asked to leave and the action that we intend to take as a result will be sent to you. You will be given the opportunity to discuss the matter with us in a calm and civil manner. If the incident is particularly serious or is repeated you may be barred from the premises.
- The following behaviours <u>are not acceptable</u>:
 - Swearing, spitting, shouting, threatening words or gestures
 - Physical intimidation and the use of force such as pushing, pulling, poking, prodding, etc.
 - * Racist, ageist and sexiest comments
 - Being under the influence of drugs or alcohol whilst on our premises
 - Smoking whilst on our premises

- do all classwork and homework to the best of their ability
- treat others in school, both adults and children, with respect
- value the contributions of other children regardless of their race, religion or gender
