English:

This term we will be writing stories that builds suspense and the focus will be on describing settings, characters and atmosphere. We will use the short film, *Alma*. We will also be learning to write a balanced argument after reading Anthony Browne's book Zoo. After half term, we will be reading "Shackleton's Journey" and writing newspaper reports.
