Geography in Year 6

Year 6 were lucky enough to have a special visitor from the 'Thames Explorer Trust'', who wanted to educated us about Rivers and the River Thames.

During his visit, we looked at aerial and satellite photos of the source and mouth of the River Thames and watched a fascinating time lapse video of the tide moving in and out.

We also became captain of the Knock Nevis oil tanker (the size of 54 London buses) and planned short and safe routes from Mauritius, Japan and Jamaica to the United Kingdom. Can we really survive without rivers? If you want to know the answer, just ask any Year 6 child!



On Tuesday 26th November, Year One walked to Winchmore Hill Baptist Church. The children were so wonderfully behaved in the church and listened carefully to the minister as he explained the Christmas Story in detail using figurines. The children learnt about how the church welcomes people at Christmas time and were given the opportunity to ask some of their inquisitive questions about the Christmas Story. We were also lucky enough to be shown the baptistery and were explained what it is used for and why people may wish to be baptised. We thoroughly enjoyed our visit which has consolidated our learning in our RE topic, 'The Nativity Story' and now we have a better understanding of why Christmas is celebrated by Christians.

Regular attendance and punctuality at school is very important for your child's wellbeing. Children who miss school are missing out on essential social interaction which can affect their ability to make friends. The facts show that if your child doesn't attend school regularly, they are less likely to do as well as other children.

At Highfield we are committed to working together with parents to increase the attendance and punctuality of all our pupils.

Although being absent cannot always be helped as we all do become ill from time to time, please note at Highfield School we expect all our children to aim for 100% attendance each half term and to be on time every day, every week! Take a look at the table below to show you exactly what your child could be missing over the year.


TIME ABSENT FROM SCHOOL	ATTENDANCE

10 DAYS	95% attendance
19 DAYS	90% attendance
28 DAYS	85% attendance
More than half a term	80% attendance
9 + weeks	75% attendance

EVERY MINUTE COUNTS

As well as being absent a lot from school effecting your child's development being **LATE** also has a big effect, please look at the table below.

<u>Lateness = Lost Learning</u> (figures below are calculated over a school year)	
5 mins late each day	3 days lost
10 mins late each day	6.5 days lost
15 mins late each day	10 days lost
20 mins late each day	13 days lost
30 mins late each day	19 days lost

Every day your child is absent from school affects their education! You will notice from the figures above, that the odd day off really does mount up. Please be aware that Highfield School WILL NOT AUTHORISE any HOLIDAYS during term time, this is done in the interest of your child's education.
