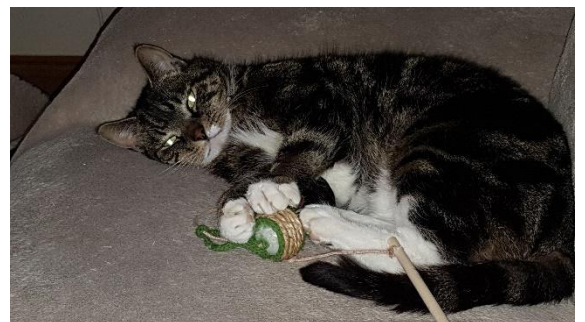
And now a few words about how I am spending my time during the school closure:
