This week we will be writing letters to thank people in our community.

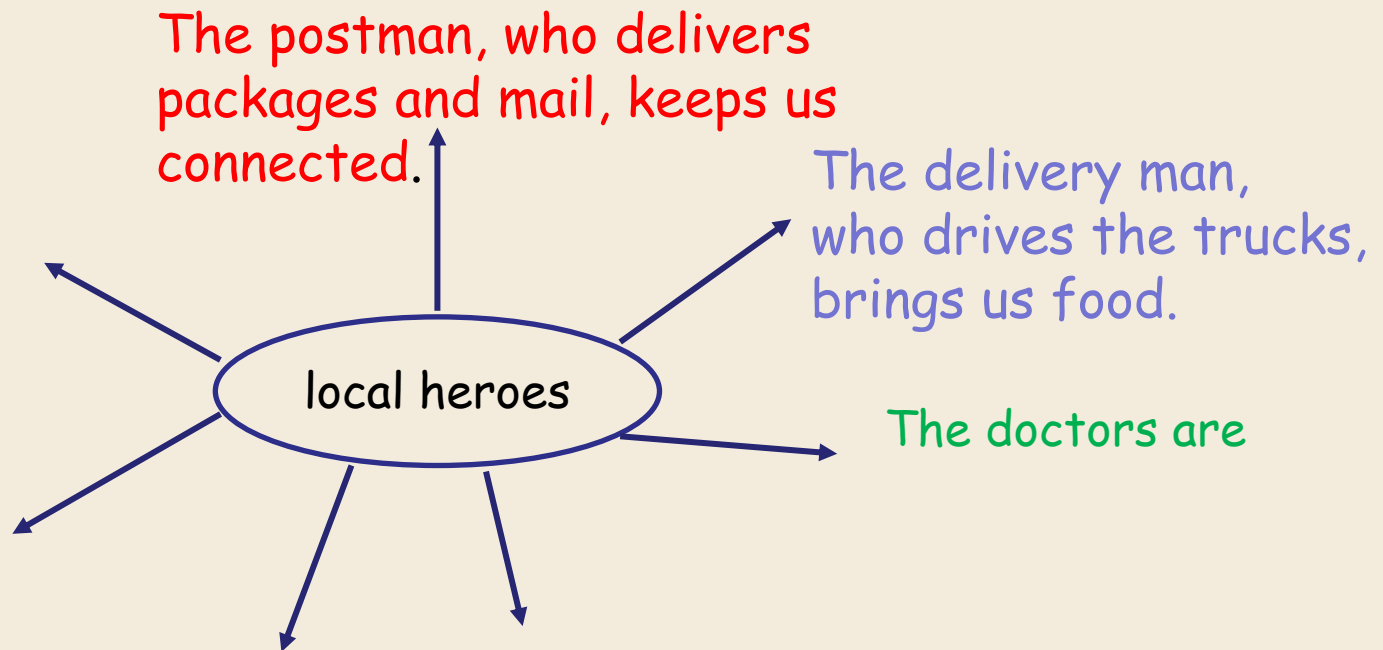
Recently, we have been looking in the PSHE at community. On the news and at home, people have been talking about the everyday heroes in our community.

Final Copy

On your final copy use the school address.

Use your best joined handwriting to write the letter out again. Take your time. Take a photo and upload your letter to your teacher.

Put your letter in an envelope to leave for the person you have written in to or post it on your window.

If you are not going to see the person (policeman, doctor, nurse) you wrote to, then your teacher will try to email it to a local place so that these people receive your thanks.
