

Admission Criteria

- Rules used to decide which children are offered places when there
 are more applications than places available.
- Rules may differ between local authorities and types of schools.
- Check school and local authority websites in case there are any changes to the information in LA booklets





Community School Admission Criteria (summary - see booklet for full details)

- children in public care or previously adopted
- children for whom a particular school is appropriate on exceptional medical grounds
- children with a brother or sister attending the school at the time of admission (living at the same address)
- children of members of staff
- children living nearest to the school measured as the "crow flies"

 Enfield County School for Girls has a quota system of allocation

Partially or Fully Selective Schools

- Selective schools aim to test children before the closing date for applications.
- Children must be registered directly with the schools to be entered for the relevant selective tests/trials/auditions
- Where possible, schools will let parents have the results of the tests/trial/audition before the closing date for the Borough application.





Partially or Fully Selective Schools

- If results are not available before 31October closing date, you will still need to include the school in your application
- If, after receiving information about the outcome of the test, you want to change your preferred schools, you should make this request as soon as possible and no later than 9th December.

Changes to Testing Arrangements for Selective Schools, 2021 Intake

In response to a range of Covid-19 related issues which make early autumn admissions testing undesirable and impractical, many schools which test for a child's ability or aptitude have decided to postpone admission tests until later in the autumn term.

In Enfield, the school affected is The Latymer School. The Office for the Schools Adjudicator has recently approved the request to vary the arrangements for the 2021 testing and full details of the revised dates are available on the School's website:

Despite these changes, parents should still submit their common application by the national closing date, 31st October 2020.

If you are an Enfield resident parent/carer:

- Once you receive the results of the test, you may make changes to your application preferences (such as to add or remove a selective school) providing you notify esas@enfield.gov.uk before 10th December 2020. Changes to preference after this date will only be considered after 1st March 2021
- We will similarly accommodate changes to preference relating to late test results for selective schools in other Local Authority areas.

If you are not an Enfield resident parent/carer:

 Please contact your home local authority for their policy on making changes to a school admission application.

What can Enfield parents expect?

- one local authority application for all maintained schools (community, foundation, voluntary aided, free school and academy) regardless of where the school is located
- common closing date across England for the submission of forms – 31st October 2020
- 6 preferences across London (Hertfordshire will only accept four Hertfordshire schools – don't include more)
- equal consideration given to each school asked for



What can Enfield parents expect?

- Enfield will apply on your behalf for schools outside the Borough.
- Late applications or changes of preference after the closing date will only be accepted in exceptional circumstances
- If your child is eligible for more than one school, the preference order will be used to decide the final offer
- Single offer emailed to parents/carers on 1st March 2021

Applying online for a school place is quick and easy. Follow the steps in this leaflet and you are ready to start your child's online application.

- Each screen will explain what you need to do; more information is available wherever you see this o icon, just click on it.
- 2 videos are available on the website to watch:
 - Creating a new account
 - Resetting your password and finding out your username

 When you first use the website you can download it as an app to the device you are using. Just follow the instructions.

Step 1: Getting started

- Before you start your online application, you will need to do some research.
- Visit your local authority's website for details about how applications are processed.
- Find schools in your area by using the Map.
- Read the admissions criteria for the schools you are interested in.
- Visit schools.
- · Check how places were offered in previous years.
- You should check transport policies for local authorities (outside London).

Step 2: What to do if this is the first time you are applying online using eAdmissions

- You will then be asked to create your own password.
- Login to the eAdmissions website using the username and password that you have just created.
- You will be sent a validation email containing your username and instructions on how to validate your email address
- The email will also contain a link which will take you to the eAdmissions login page to start your application.
- Please keep your username and password safe as you will need them to login and apply for any other children you have, and to see the outcome of your application. (It will be March for Secondary & 14/19 applications and April for Reception and Junior applications)
- You can opt to receive push notifications during the admissions process from an android phone or if you have an Apple device you can sign up to get notifications by downloading the 'ParentComms' mobile App.
- You can opt to receive text messages to your device during the admissions process, however you will not receive your outcome by text.
- It is important that you register well before the deadline in case there are any problems making your application. The closing dates are:
 - 31 October for Secondary & 14/19 applications
 - 15 January for Reception and Junior applications

Step 3: What to do if you have applied before using eAdmissions or you have just registered and received your username

- On the home page select 'Returning visitors' and enter your username and password.
- If you have forgotten your username we can re-

On Line Applications

- It is quick and easy to do just register and follow the instructions
- You will get an email confirmation once you submit your application
- The online system checks that you are completing all the right sections of the application
- The online system is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week until midnight on the closing date



You can get your result on the evening of 1 March 2021 and either accept and decline your offer on line



Making your application

Make sure you tell us...

 If the child is looked after or adopted?



- Are there brothers or sisters attending any of the schools you apply for?
- Does a parent work at any of the schools listed on your form?



Making your application

- Provide supporting information with your application if you are asking for medical priority
- Be sure the address you use is the child's usual place of residence.
 Attach details if not
- Include your council tax reference number in your application.
- Complete any supplementary forms and send them directly to the schools
- Meet all the deadlines

- Distance counts for many schools and will often be a deciding factor if there are more applications than places available.
