Message from Headteacher - SEPTEMBER 2020

First of all I would like to welcome everybody back. It has been a very long time since the school has been fully open and these first few weeks have been a reminder to myself what a great job we have as educators and how wonderful the school feels when it is fully open. Our attendance has been at almost 95% over the first 3 weeks and given the circumstances that is excellent. All the staff have done an excellent job welcoming the children back and it has been great to see children learning again. Everyone has really enjoyed being back at school. The children have adapted to our new systems and procedures really well and their behaviour has been excellent.

I would also like to take the opportunity to thank parents and carers. As a senior leadership team we have been really impressed how you have followed our new procedures, both in the adjusted drop off/collection times and following the rules regarding testing and self-isolating, particularly as I know tests have not been easy to get.

It is difficult to know exactly what the future looks like and we know there will be tough times ahead. What happens outside of the school obviously has an impact on what happens within it, but I think it is important to enjoy those happy times when they come and this first 3 weeks of term has certainly felt like that.

Flu vaccine

You will have recently been sent information about the flu vaccine that is available to all primary school children. This year it will be more important than ever to get children vaccinated. Colds and flu like symptoms are very common, especially in young children, but this year, if your child has these symptoms it will mean household self-isolation and having to book a test. We have already seen what testing is currently like and it will have to significantly increase if the system is going to cope through the Winter months. This could mean even more time at school lost. It is of course your right to decide whether your child has the vaccination or not but our advice would be, that unless there is a good medical reason for your child not to have the vaccination, to give permission for your child to have it.

DRIVING SAFELY & PARKING AROUND THE SCHOOL

We would like to remind parents to park considerately, thinking about where you leave your cars whilst dropping your children off to school. It is absolutely vital that parents/carers DO NOT park over our neighbours' driveways or directly in front of the school gates (as seen in the image below). We appreciate that parking is limited, but the relationship we have with local residents is really important to the success of our school and as always, the safety of our children remains paramount. Please also remember you do have the option to park in Sainsbury's and walk over. We also encourage as many of our families as possible to walk, scoot or cycle to school.
