Writing - Composition			
I can write a narrative about mine and others' experiences (real and fictional), after discussion with the teacher			
I can write about real events, recording these simply and clearly			
I can write down ideas and use accurately key words, including new vocabulary

I can proof-read to check for errors in spelling, grammar and punctuation (for example, ends of sentences punctuated correctly)			
I can write for different purposes, adjusting my style of writing effectively, after discussion with the teacher			
Writing – Grammar (sentence structure)			
I can use sentences with different forms in my writing (statements, questions, exclamations and commands)			
I can use present and past tense mostly correctly and consistently			
I can use co-ordination (or/and/but) and some subordination (when/if/that/because)			
I can use some expanded noun phrases to describe and specify			
Writing - Punctuation			
I can mostly use correctly	Full stops and capital letters

Writing - Spelling			
I can split spoken words into phonemes and represent these by graphemes, spelling many correctly			
I can spell many common exception words (most)

I can add suffixes to spell some words correctly in my writing, e.g. –ment, -ness, -ful, -less, -ly			
I can spell the above mostly correctly			
Writing - Handwriting			
I can use spacing between words that reflects the size of the letters			
I can write capital letters and digits of the correct size, orientation and relationship to one another and to lower-case letters			
I can use the diagonal and horizontal strokes needed to join letters in some of my writing			
I can use the diagonal strokes needed to join letters in most of my writing
