French: Our unit this term is On y va (All Aboard) when children will learn to name different modes of transportation. After half term, we will focus on colours and descriptions of the face.

Computing: In computing lessons, children will learn about all aspects of E-Safety and how to use search technologies. In the second half of the term children will learn to program with Scratch.
