Reading Road Map

At Highfield, we encourage reading for pleasure through 'The Reading Road Map' initiative which is aimed at broadening children's reading horizons.

We believe that the best way to increase literacy levels in school is through reading for pleasure and having a strong reading culture across the school. Research shows that the children in schools who participate in the Road Map read a wider range of books and discuss reading with their peers more than they would do otherwise. The Reading Road Map is an initiative that has been created to help encourage children to develop a new passion for reading. It is a tool for children, parents and educators to recommend different up to date books, authors and genres.

Every Year 3 and Year 5 class has a set of the Reading Road Map books.

The Year 3&4 Road Map features 40 titles and authors. By having the Map with its 40 titles and 8 genres and with easy access to the books on the map, children have the ability to explore different books and share recommendations with their peers.

The Year 5&6 Reading Road Map has 60 titles and authors. By having access to the Map and all the titles on it, children have the ability to explore all the different titles and discover new authors and genres they may not have tried before.

For the UK Reading Road Map Years 3/4:

Each child in the class will receive a copy of the road map.
When a child has read 5 books they receive a Bronze certificate
When a child has read 10 books they receive a Silver certificate
When a child has read 15 books they receive a Gold certificate
When a child has read 25 books they receive a Platinum certificate

For The Reading Road Map Years 5/6:

Each child in the class will receive a copy of the road map.
When a child has read 5 books they receive a Bronze certificate
When a child has read 10 books they receive a Silver certificate
When a child has read 20 books they receive a Gold certificate
When a child has read 40 books they receive a Platinum certificate

Self-isolation guidance

Self-isolation guidance changed on Monday 17th January.

If your child tests positive on a PCR or LFD test (Day 0), their self-isolation period is initially 10 full days but this could now be reduced to 5 full days. To see if this is possible, your child should take LFD tests on day 5 and day 6 of their self-isolation period. If your child receives two negative test results, they can stop their self-isolation. The first LFD test must be taken no earlier than day 5 and tests must be taken 24-hours apart. If both tests are negative and your child does not have a high-temperature, they may end their self-isolation after the second negative test result and return to school from day 6. They should not take any further LFD tests.

Reminders

Please ensure your ParentPay account is up to date and there are sufficient funds to cover your child's school lunches. Please also ensure you select your child's school lunch via SchoolGrid so the canteen staff can cook enough of each meal. You can book up to a term in advance. Thank you.
