The play follows a family experiencing domestic abuse and explores the effects on the mental health of children who witness it. It is both humorous and thought-provoking.

The Year 5 audience shared lots of practical and emotional thinking about what they could do if they were in a similar situation.


After the theatre piece, pupils interacted with the characters and considered what they could have done to get the help they needed and deserved.

The children also had the opportunity to speak to a counsellor to discuss personal issues raised by the play, if they needed to.

Aims of the performance:

- To improve the emotional health and wellbeing of people aged 9
 11 years old
- To develop strategies for dealing with violence in the home to increase resilience, reduce stress and improve general emotional wellbeing.
- To raise awareness about domestic violence, teaching peer support skills and informing children about how to get help and support.









A visit from Farmer John!

On Tuesday 14th March, John (who is a farmer from Yorkshire) visited children at Highfield to talk about how he runs his farm. John showed us pictures of the different animals in his farm and the jobs that they do. The children also learnt about what the farm is like in different seasons and the impact this has on the harvest. Farmer John used this analogy to show how farmers bid for different cattle at an auction. This visit was organised to kick-start the children thinking about GROWTH, as this is what this year's STEM Week will be about.

A big thank you to Farmer John for coming down to London to share his experiences of being a farmer!


Journalist Visit in Year 4

Friday 24th March 2023

The year one children came to school dressed as a person from the Victorian era to experience what it might be like to attend school at this time. We had a morning hand inspection, before writing our letters and alphabet with chalk and slate. We adhered to rules such as standing up when an adult came into the room and asking for permission to speak. We learned about what schooling was like in

Victorian times compared with today. We were also lucky to have a visit from a year 6 parent who talked to the children about what Highfield was like in the past as she, her father and grandfather are all former pupils.

Curriculum Spotlight English



In Nursery we have been learning about Humpty Dumpty. We thought about how Humpty Dumpty got onto the wall, how he fell off, and also what might happen if he did not fall off the wall. We built a wall for Humpty Dumpty, and then sat on the wall to sing the nursery rhyme. William: "Humpty Dumpty climbed up the wall with a ladder." Aiko: "it was slippery, that's why Humpty Dumpty fell off the wall." Kushi: "So Humpty Dumpty could dance on the wall."

Reception

In Reception we have been learning all about the story 'The Gruffalo' by Julia Donaldson. We were very lucky to bring the book alive this month by making Gruffalo crumble and visiting the Gruffalo trail. We have been using adjectives to describe the Gruffalo, writing sentences to recount our trip and using a story S to recall and sequence the key events. We have also looked at non-fiction recipe texts.






In Year 1 this month the children have been learning about the story 'The Lonely Beast' by Chris Judge. They wrote sentences about what the Lonely Beast did using the past tense and had lots of fun creating their own versions of the story about the Lonely Beast visiting Highfield. The children have also been exploring different text types in the book 'The Jolly Postman'. They have been hot seating characters and writing letters.

Year 2

In March, the children in Year 2 have been studying the story 'Grace and Family' by Mary Hoffman. As part of their learning, the children wrote a character description about Grace's appearance and personality. The children have also been identifying the key features of an informal letter and then used this knowledge to aid them when writing their own informal letter from Grace's perspective to her mum back home. In addition, the children have been looking at the importance of instructions and how to use imperative verbs in sentences appropriately. This then helped the children when they wrote their own set of instructions.



Year 3

In Year 3 this month, the children have been learning about the story 'Katie's Picture Show' by James Mayhew. The children acted out and created a plan for the part of the story where Katie entered the painting 'Tiger in a Tropical Storm' by Henri Rousseau. The children wrote a narrative including dialogue using their plan. Additionally, the children in Year 3 have also been studying Mary Anning linking their learning to their Science topic on rocks and fossils. As part of this, the children learnt about the features of a newspaper report, how to write headlines that capture the reader's attention and learnt about the differences between facts and opinion and how to identify these. The children also used drama and hot seating to develop their ideas of the key events in Mary's discovery and created a plan, all of which aided them with their writing of their newspaper report.

<u>Curriculum Spotlight</u> English





As part of their English work, the children in Year 4 have been studying the book 'Iron Man' by Ted Hughes and have been describing the characters from the story using expanded noun phrases, similes and metaphors. The children also wrote sentences using varying starters and considered how to edit and improve a descriptive paragraph. The children were then given the opportunity to create a new character using expanded noun phrases and metaphors and used these ideas to help them to write a description on their newly created character.

Year 5

In March, Year 5 have been learning about the text 'Floodland' by Marcus Sedgwick and made a plan detailing what they would include in an instructional text all about floods and flooding. The children then created a leaflet using their plans and included information on how to prepare for a flood, flood safety and how to act during and after such a devasting natural disaster. Additionally, the children have also considered how authors advance action and create an atmosphere within a narrative and created a word bank describing the character Dooby from the story focussing on his personality, appearance and actions. The children then wrote a character description using the concept 'show not tell' in their writing.







In Year 6 this month, the children have been studying the story 'Rose Blanche' and have been exploring how to use parenthesis and active and passive voice in their work. The children also learnt about the features of a newspaper report, how to write a catchy headline and an introductory paragraph. Using the plan that they created, the children wrote a newspaper article reporting the disappearance of Rose Blanche carefully selecting interesting words and phrases. The children have also been learning about the Windrush and generated vocabulary banks about the emotions explored throughout this topic. To prepare them for writing their own diary entry, the children learned about the features of a diary entry, wrote sentences using emotive language in the context of a Windrush diary and created their own plan for their diary.

Berry Class

In Berry class for our core text 'From Head To Toe' the children were learning about the different body parts that the animals used. They acted out the story by thumping their chest like the gorilla, bending their neck like the giraffe and kicking their legs like a donkey.



<u>Curriculum Spotlight</u> Maths



Nursery

In Nursery we have been learning about the number 3 and making patterns with shapes and different Maths resources. Yahya: "I was doing a circle of spiders and bugs." Siyana: "I was making a picture of patterns and line-ups."

Reception

In Reception we have been learning about number bonds to 10. We have been using lots of practical equipment, particularly Numicon, to find the bonds to 10. We have also had lots of fun making different patterns using actions, objects, colours, shapes, sizes, numbers and letters.





Year 1


In Year 1 this month, the children have been learning about place value to 50. This has involved them partitioning 2-digit numbers into tens and ones, ordering numbers and saying one more and one less than a given number. They have also started to learn about lengths and heights. The children have had lots of fun comparing and ordering different objects, including themselves, according to length/height. They have also been measuring using non-standard units and been learning about centimetres.

Year 2

Year 2 have been learning a lot about measuring this month. The children have been using lots of different equipment to measure and compare. The children have used scales to measure ingredients to make play dough and balancing scales to compare the mass of objects. They have been learning about temperature and used thermometers to check their predictions of the temperature of different places around our school. The children have also been comparing volume and capacity and learnt how to measure in millilitres and litres.







Maths

Year 3

This month in Maths, Year 3 have been continuing their learning on fractions and started their new unit on mass and capacity. The children have been learning how to count, order and place fractions on a number line. In addition to this, the children have been finding equivalent fractions using number lines and bar models. As part of their unit on mass and capacity, the children have been learning about how to read and use scales, measuring and comparing masses in kilograms and grams, measuring and comparing capacity and volume in millilitres and litres. They have also been exploring addition and subtraction using mass and capacity.

Year 4

Year 4 have been learning to partition mixed numbers, use number lines with mixed numbers and how to convert between mixed numbers and improper fractions. The children have been learning to find equivalent fractions using a number line and explored equivalent fraction families to solve problems. They have started to add fractions, including proper fractions and mixed number fractions.





Year 5

In Year 5, the children have been continuing to learn about decimals. They have been subtracting decimals within 1, adding decimals crossing the whole and adding and subtracting numbers with the same and different number of decimal places. They have also been sequencing decimals and learning to multiply decimals by 10, 100 and 1000. The children have been using their understanding of this to solve problems and reason to explain and prove their answers.

Year 6

In Maths, Year 6 have been consolidating their learning of fractions, decimals and percentages. They have been learning to multiply and divide fractions and mixed numbers and convert between fractions, decimals and percentages. They have also been solving problems involving these topics. The children have also begun to explore BODMAS and the order of operations.

Berry Class

The children in Berry have been learning about place value to 20 and understanding what the numbers are. They have found many different numbers all the way to 20.

Regular attendance and punctuality at school is very important for your child's wellbeing. Children who miss school are missing out on essential social interaction which can affect their ability to make friends. If your child doesn't attend school regularly, they are less likely to do as well as other children.

At Highfield we are committed to working together with parents to increase the attendance and punctuality of all our pupils.

Although being absent cannot always be helped, at Highfield School we expect all our children to aim for 100% attendance each half term and to be on time every day, every week! Take a look at the table below to show you exactly what your child could be missing over the year

Every day your child is absent from school affects their education! You will notice from the figures above, that the odd day off really does mount up. Please be aware that Highfield School WILL NOT AUTHORISE any HOLIDAYS during term time, this is done in the interest of your child's education.
