# **6A's Science Workshop at Winchmore School**

On Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> June, 6A visited Winchmore Secondary School for a Science Workshop. They took part in several fun and interactive investigations. The children tested the pH of liquids and decided if the liquids were acid, alkaline or neutral. They observed the colour change of salts when heated using a Bunsen burner. At the end of the session the teachers, lab technicians and a 6<sup>th</sup> form students demonstrated a screaming jelly baby experiment and a rocket in a bottle experiment. 6A had a fantastic learning experience and wish to thank the staff of Winchmore!
