Creative Writing Week 16-20th October

This week the children have had a fantastic time exploring their own ideas for writing creatively.

Early Years have been mark writing, creating characters and writing indoors and out - on the floor, on boxes, in mini books and even under the tables! Year 1 created their own animals to write stories about.

Year 2 chose a tiger theme and wrote poems, fact files, stories, news reports and even songs.

Year 3 wrote about an unexpected and unexplained visitor to Highfield. Year 5 focused on an oceans theme and have produced some incredible writing.


Years 4 and 6 followed their own individual ideas and have written comics, poems, fact files, autobiographies, mystery, thriller and adventure stories.

We are so proud of everything they have achieved and know they have also enjoyed sharing their ideas and writing with their parents/carers!

Year 4 Synagogue Trip

Year 4 visited the Cockfosters and North Southgate Synagogue as part of their RE learning focused on Judaism. Whilst there, the children had the opportunity to explore the surroundings and to ask Rabbi Schindler questions about some of the special items/features that they noticed. They saw some Hebrew writing and learnt that Hebrew books are read from back to front and right to left. The children were also lucky enough to see the sacred Torah and learnt that when they take this out during any Service (e.g. Shabbat), bells on the end of this jingle to remind people to stand and show their respect. They also learnt that the beautiful stained glass windows lining one of the walls of the Synagogue were gifted to them and represent different Bible Stories, one of them representing Moses. Rabbi Schindler then modelled how a Prayer Shawl (Tallit) is worn and explained these are worn to pray. On our way out the children also got to walk through the 'Sukkah' - This is a temporary hut constructed for use during the week-long Jewish festival of Sukkot. It was topped with branches and decorated with autumnal images and decorations, some of which had been created by local children and families.

As well as demonstrating exemplary behaviour during the trip, the children also showcased their vast knowledge of this religion that they have retained from recent RE lessons - You made us all very proud Year 4; Well done!



Year 1 Church Trip

Year 1 were really lucky to visit Holy Trinity Church in Winchmore Hill on Friday 13th October 2023. They took their Harvest festival contributions and placed them at the front of the church so that they could be donated to a local charity who needed it. They had the opportunity to sit in the pews of the church and listened to a talk by Father Morris. He told them all about Harvest and what happens at this time of year. Year 1 then had the opportunity to sing their Harvest song that they have been learning.




World Homeless Day

On Tuesday 10th October, we observed World Homeless Day. Children watched a PowerPoint which taught them why some people are homeless and what we can do to help. Some activities were:

Year 1 and Berry class, visited our local church within the week and discussed the importance of helping others less fortunate than ourselves and when they got back to class they completed an activity about needs and wants.

Year 2 came up with ideas about how they could help the homeless people.

Year 4 looked at true or false statements and gave reasons for their answers and corrected any misconceptions people have about homeless people and their situations.





Drama4ALL Workshops

On Tuesday 3rd October Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 were lucky enough to take part in drama sessions run by Drama4ALL. The children got the opportunity to 'meet' Phileas Fogg and travel with him on an exciting globe trotting adventure around the world. The children had the opportunity to learn a song about Australia, become animals they saw along the way and also act out a range of dilemmas that they faced. The children were able to link their pervious Geography knowledge and build on this during the workshops.



The children had a wonderful time during the workshop and we are very grateful that Drama4ALL were able come to our school.

Year 2 - Diwali Day -13th October 2023

To celebrate the children's learning about Diwali, in year 2 we had a Diwali day! The children came to

school wearing colourful clothing to begin the Diwali celebrations. In class we learned all about Rangoli patterns and we created our own Rangoli patterns using playdough and a range of colourful beans, seeds and lentils. We learned a Bollywood style dance as well as making paper candles. We watched videos of families celebrating Diwali. We also were very lucky to have some of the children's parents talk to us about how they celebrate Diwali as a family whilst sharing their traditions. They also revisited the story of Rama and Sita.



5C Class Assembly: Oceans

On Friday 13th October, 5C presented their assembly on Oceans to Year 5, Year 6 and their parents and carers. All children worked incredibly hard to share their knowledge from our Geography unit on Oceans and how climate change is affecting our world. 5C also learnt two beautiful songs (What a Wonderful World and The Clean Up Song) to express their compassion for the world and its oceans. Also, 5C also designed and created their own River and Oceans Clean Inventions and shared these as part of our assembly. It was a brilliant assembly and enjoyed by all!



Aspirations Week (Monday 16th October-Friday 20th October)

This term our school was transformed into a buzzing hub of inspiration during our Aspirations Week. This term we organised Aspirations Week (w/b 16th October 2023). It provided a fantastic opportunity for children to develop an understanding of the link between their school learning and the broader world of work. Aspirations Week enabled children to expand their awareness of the array of future job possibilities, breaking down stereotypes and challenging biases. We were incredibly grateful that some very kind parents generously volunteered to come to the school, where they shared insights about their careers through workshops or assemblies during the week. On Friday, 20th October, children came to school dressed up as what they aspire to be when they grow up.

Regular attendance and punctuality at school is very important for your child's wellbeing. Children who miss school are missing out on essential social interaction which can affect their ability to make friends. If your child doesn't attend school regularly, they are less likely to do as well as other children.

At Highfield we are committed to working together with parents to increase the attendance and punctuality of all our pupils.

Although being absent cannot always be helped, at Highfield School we expect all our children to aim for 100% attendance each half term and to be on time every day, every week! Take a look at the table below to show you exactly what your child could be missing over the year.

EVERY MINUTE COUNTS

As well as being absent a lot from school effecting your child's development being **LATE** also has a big effect, please look at the table below.

<u>Lateness = Lost Learning</u> (figures below are calculated over a school year)	
5 mins late each day	3 days lost
10 mins late each day	6.5 days lost
15 mins late each day	10 days lost
20 mins late each day	13 days lost
30 mins late each day	19 days lost

Every day your child is absent from school affects their education! You will notice from the figures above, that the odd day off really does mount up. Please be aware that Highfield School WILL NOT AUTHORISE any HOLIDAYS during term time, this is done in the interest of your child's education.
