Nursery Curriculum News Spring 2025.

Whole school topic: Creative

## Communication and Language:

We will continue to concentrate on developing:

- Listening skills.
- Communicating clearly with others.
- Speaking in full sentences.
- Using correct vocabulary.

### Physical Development:

Children will have daily access to the outside areas, developing their gross motor skills. Fine motor skills will be developed through a variety of activities, including cutting and sticking, puzzles and construction equipment. We will also be working on children writing their own names, using correct letter formation.

### Mathematics:

We will be working on a range of concepts, which will be linked to a story, including:

- Subitising (fast recognition of up to 3 objects without having to count them).
- Describing simple positions.
- Explaining and making simple patterns.
- Matching shapes.
- Making collections of large and small objects.

#### Literacy:

We will continue to follow Little Wandle Foundations for Phonics, learning a new phoneme (letter sound) each week, and focusing on oral blending and segmenting of words. We will also continue daily Rhyme Time, learning a new nursery rhyme each week.

Our main texts this term will be linked to our Maths curriculum, and will include 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears', 'Where's Spot?', 'Postman Bear', 'The Train Ride', and 'Oliver's Fruit Salad'. We will be encouraging the children to join in with stories, track the text from left to right, and talk about and retell their favourite stories.

Your child will now be able to choose a book to take home each week. We will be providing zippy bags for each child to use as their book bag. Books will only be changed on Friday.

We will also be encouraging each child to practise writing their name, using correct letter formation.
