If your child has scabies

As you will be aware there have been a small number of cases of scabies in the school. Please read the advice below;

If your child has scabies or If you suspect that you or your child may have scabies, please see your GP or a pharmacist, and take the letter the school sent with you. If it is diagnosed as scabies, they will prescribe treatment for the infected person and all the members of your household (even those who have no symptoms), which will need to be followed. Treatment through the GP is free of charge for children (18 years and under). Please inform the school regarding your child's diagnosis.

Exclusion advice if diagnosed with scabies

If your child has scabies, please keep your child away from school (and stay away from work if you are an adult with scabies) until the day after having the first treatment. E.g., if the treatment is applied in the morning, the child or adult being treated should remain home for a full 24 hours from the start of the treatment. Similarly, if the treatment is applied at night, the child or adult being treated would need to be at home for the whole of the following day to complete the 24 hours period of staying away.

Dangerous Parking

Unfortunately, we continue to have a small number of adults who are parking illegally and dangerously outside the school at pick up and drop off times. People that are doing this are making the road outside the school dangerous for our children. This needs to stop! If you do need to drive to drop your child at school, our advice would be to park at Sainsbury's, which is a very short walk from the school. We need to consider the safety of all our of pupils.

Reception Wetlands Trip

On Wednesday 5th February Reception went on a trip to Firs Farm Wetlands. The children created their own 'Bog Baby' linked to our core text and the children then hid them around the Wetlands. The children were so excited to find a hiding place for their 'Bog Baby' and for them to go on a new adventure. The children also had the chance to play in the outside play area, feed the ducks and also go on a winter walk. The children enjoyed looking at their checklist and trying to find as many of the winter items as they could. A fantastic time was had by all!
