



Year 4 Creative Writing Club (4NC Group)

Year 1

History

As part of our history topic 'How did the opening of Winchmore Hill train station change the local area?' Year 1 went on their first field trip around the local area and visited Winchmore Hill station. Armed with photos of how the various places looked in the Victorian era, they were able to make observations and compare the differences.





Year 1

History

The year one children came to school dressed as a person from the Victorian era to experience what it might be like to attend school at this time. We had a morning hand inspection, before writing our letters and alphabet with chalk and slate. We adhered to rules such as standing up when an adult came into the room and asking for permission to speak. We learned about what schooling was like in Victorian times compared with today. We were also lucky to have a visit from Mrs Yianni who talked to the children about what Highfield was like in the past as she and her children are all former pupils.



<u>RE</u>

As part of our learning in RE, Year 1 celebrated the Hindu festival of Holi. The children had lots of fun experiencing this colourful festival to consolidate what they have been learning about.



Enfield Netball League 2025 Winners!

Everyone at Highfield is pleased to announce that Highfield are Enfield Netball league champions for 2025!

The team consisting of Sena (6G), Ayla (6M), Paloma (6M), Logan (6MB), Isla (6M), Freddie (6MB) and Harriet (6MB) all did fantastically well across all of their fixtures winning every single match.

On the first match day out netballers played 3 fantastic matches and won every single match without conceding and scoring 27 points! On the second match day it was looking likely that if Highfield could defeat Bush Hill Park then the second fixture against Raglan 1s would be a straight shoot out for the title. Highfield started the match against Bush Hill Park brightly taking a 4-0 lead into half time. There was the final match to play against Raglan 2nds and despite conceding 3 early points Highfield came back to win 8-3.

<u>Curriculum Spotlight</u> Maths



Nursery

In Nursery we have been learning about shapes through the book 'The Train Ride'. The children have made and talked about arrangements. We have also been subitising! The children are becoming more familiar with dot patterns and recognising the number of dots in different arrangements. We have been finishing the term by looking at the story 'Oliver's Fruit Salad' to learn how to compare collections using the key vocabulary 'more', 'fewer' and 'same'.

Reception

In Reception we have been learning about number bonds to 10. We have been using lots of practical equipment, particularly Numicon, to find the bonds to 10. We have also had lots of fun making different patterns using actions, objects, colours, shapes, sizes, numbers and letters.

Year 1

In Year 1 this month, the children have been learning about place value to 50. This has involved them partitioning 2-digit numbers into tens and ones, ordering numbers and saying one more and one less than a given number. They have also started to learn about lengths and heights. The children have had lots of fun comparing and ordering different objects, including themselves, according to length/height. They have also been measuring using non-standard units and been learning about centimetres.

Year 2

Year 2 have been learning a lot about measuring this month. The children have been using lots of different equipment to measure and compare. The children have used scales to measure ingredients to make play dough and balancing scales to compare the mass of objects. They have been learning about temperature and used thermometers to check their predictions of the temperature of different places around our school. The children have also been comparing volume and capacity and learnt how to measure in millilitres and litres.

Year 3

This month in Maths, Year 3 have been continuing their learning on fractions and started their new unit on mass and capacity. The children have been learning how to count, order and place fractions on a number line. In addition to this, the children have been finding equivalent fractions using number lines and bar models. As part of their unit on mass and capacity, the children have been learning about how to read and use scales, measuring and comparing masses in kilograms and grams, measuring and comparing capacity and volume in millilitres and litres. They have also been exploring addition and subtraction using mass and capacity.

Year 4

Year 4 have been learning to partition mixed numbers, use number lines with mixed numbers and how to convert between mixed numbers and improper fractions. The children have been learning to find equivalent fractions using a number line and explored equivalent fraction families to solve problems.

They have started to add fractions, including proper fractions and mixed number fractions.

Year 5

In Year 5, the children have been continuing to learn about decimals. They have been subtracting decimals within 1, adding decimals crossing the whole and adding and subtracting numbers with the same and different number of decimal places. They have also been sequencing decimals and learning to multiply decimals by 10, 100 and 1000. The children have been using their understanding of this to solve problems and reason to explain and prove their answers.

Year 6

In Maths, Year 6 have been reading and interpreting pie charts, dual bar charts and line graphs. They have been drawing their own charts and graphs, finding the mean and solving problems using graphs. The children have also begun to explore the properties of circles and learning to measure and draw angles accurately using a protractor.



Curriculum Spotlight English



Nursery

In Nursery, the children have been learning about the story 'Oliver's Fruit Salad'. They read the story and discussed the different fruits they saw in the book. As a class, the children also wrote a shopping list of the different fruits they would like in a fruit salad.

Reception

In Reception we have been talking about our favourite books and sharing them with our friends. We talked about and wrote about why they were our favourite books and got to dress as our favourite books characters on World Book Day. We have also recently been learning all about the Easter Story that Christian's believe. We recalled and sequenced the events of the story and made and wrote our own Easter cards for our families.

Year 1

In Year 1 this month, the children have been exploring different text types in the book 'The Jolly Postman'. They wrote sentences about what happened with Goldilocks and the three bears using the past tense and explored the features of a letter. The children had lots of fun thinking about how characters felt through the use of hot seating.

Year 2

In March, the children in Year 2 have been studying the story 'One Plastic Bag: Isatou Ceesay and the Recycling Women of Gambia' by Miranda Paul. As part of their learning, the children looked at the features of a persuasive letter and persuasive language to express opinions. The children then wrote persuasive letters to Mr Wilson about the need of plastic bag recycling bins in the school.

Vear 3

In Year 3 this month, the children have been learning about the story 'Katie's Picture Show' by James Mayhew. The children acted out and created a plan for the part of the story where Katie entered the painting 'Tiger in a Tropical Storm' by Henri Rousseau. The children wrote a narrative including dialogue using their plan.

Year 4

As part of their English work, the children in Year 4 have been studying the book 'Iron Man' by Ted Hughes and have been describing the characters from the story using expanded noun phrases, similes and metaphors. The children also wrote sentences using varying starters and considered how to edit and improve a descriptive paragraph. The children were then given the opportunity to create a new character using expanded noun phrases and metaphors and used these ideas to help them to write a description on their newly created character.

Year 5

In March, Year 5 have been learning about the text 'Floodland' by Marcus Sedgwick and have been looking at different modal and imperative verbs and the features of an instructional text. The children then wrote their own instructional text about what to do in the case of a flood using their plans they made.

Year 6

In Year 6 this month, the children have been studying the story 'Rose Blanche' and have been exploring how to use parenthesis and active and passive voice in their work. The children also learnt about the features of a newspaper report, how to write a catchy headline and an introductory paragraph. Using the plan they created, the children wrote a newspaper article reporting the disappearance of Rose Blanche.

Regular attendance and punctuality at school is very important for your child's wellbeing. Children who miss school are missing out on essential social interaction which can affect their ability to make friends. If your child doesn't attend school regularly, they are less likely to do as well as other children.

At Highfield we are committed to working together with parents to increase the attendance and punctuality of all our pupils.

Although being absent cannot always be helped, at Highfield School we expect all our children to aim for 100% attendance each half term and to be on time every day, every week! Take a look at the table below to show you exactly what your child could be missing over the year.

EVERY MINUTE COUNTS

As well as being absent a lot from school effecting your child's development being **LATE** also has a big effect, please look at the table below.

<u>Lateness = Lost Learning</u> (figures below are calculated over a school year)	
5 mins late each day	3 days lost
10 mins late each day	6.5 days lost
15 mins late each day	10 days lost
20 mins late each day	13 days lost
30 mins late each day	19 days lost

Every day your child is absent from school affects their education! You will notice from the figures above, that the odd day off really does mount up. Please be aware that Highfield School WILL NOT AUTHORISE any HOLIDAYS during term time, this is done in the interest of your child's education.
